Codi, our daughter, was a huntin' fool, just like her brother and had drawn 3 Big Horn Sheep permits by the time she was 40-years-old. Some folks just have 'The Luck'. Codi and her family went on



to buy my old friend Ron Dube's camp and ran it for 8 years before selling it.

In 1993 we sold our Greybull River Camps and bought a camp in the Sunlight Basin area and later another camp in Dubois, Wyoming. We have bought or managed hunting camps in 8 different areas in the northern areas of Wyoming, mostly in the Big Horn Basin area, a couple of private ranches in the Sundance and New Castle area. We couldn't have done all of this without the help of our son, T.J. Clark, who basically ran our Emerald Creek and Wiggins Fork Camps for the last 5 or 6 years we had them. We sold these



two camps in 2020 to a basically hand-picked young man, Jimmy Owens, who is the grandson of a good friend of ours, Buck Allemand. He'll be one of the great ones, we're sure. I could go on forever with a history lesson on
