Some draws are certainly harder than others, but if you want to get lucky, you need to apply consistently and get points on years you don't hunt. I'm glad to see the state kept its long time preference point system intact. I feel fortunate to have harvested some really nice big game animals over the years, and some very edible grouse and partridge as well.
